Safe Strangers

Students have been looking at who they may go to talk to if they felt unsafe about something. We first looked at who the people in our close safety network were. We then looked at who might be safer strangers if we didn't know anyone. A Safer Stranger is someone who wears a uniform and works in the community to help other people. We can ask a police person, a firefighter, a nurse, a doctor or even a pharmacist. These people are in the community



to help us. We may not know them, but they are 'Safer Strangers'.





Senior Health

Over the past few weeks we have been learning about consent, what it means, when it can be withdrawn and what are the consequences if we do not get consent. The following laws are to be abided by if and when teenagers/ adults choose to engage in sexual activities.

It MUST be LEGAL!

- There must not be more than a 2-year age difference between the sexual partners if one of them is below the age of 18.
 - The person cannot be younger than 12.
 - Sexual partners must not be a family member.
 - Consent must be given by both persons.
 - Sex must be in a private place. No public places such as playgrounds or parks.
- If the two partners have agreed to have sexual intercourse with a condom, a condom must be used. It is a legal offense to remove or not use a condom if it was agreed upon beforehand.
- You MUST tell your partner if you have an STI/STD. It is a legal offence to withhold this information from your partner if you knowingly have an STI/STD.
